He speaks five languages fluently (including two Indigenous Australian languages), has two Masters degrees in applied linguistics and education and completed executive studies at Harvard University. He has worked with diverse audiences across the globe including the AFL, Australian Federal Treasury, Social Ventures Australia, PWC, Microsoft, Apple, Inicia Educación, and TED.

He sees education as the key lever for change and works to create positive impacts for young people, schools and organisations. He believes sharing expert knowledge in leadership, communication and wellbeing creates the positive organisational cultures vital to thrive in a rapidly shifting world. Louka is excited to be guest facilitator at the 9th National Student Leadership Summit.
